

Year 7 Music

The Year 7 Music curriculum is designed to develop and introduce key skills. The curriculum has a number of short half-term units exploring aspects of performance, composition and appraising music. We do this through a variety of mediums and instruments including vocal, keyboard work, as well as computer-based music software (Cubase and Sibelius). Lessons are updated year-on-year to match current trends in contemporary musicians and their music. Each unit has a specific focus although all aspects of the National Curriculum are developed spirally giving students experience and mastery of skills in music.
